Don Heriberto Cocom Anthropology Scholarship

The Center for Engaged Learning Abroad - CELA-Belize, offers several field courses for anthropology students over the winter break and during the summer for an enriching study abroad experience in English-speaking Belize. The courses carry three credit hours, transferrable to home institutions with prior approval.

Don Heriberto Cocom was a well-known and greatly respected Maya traditional healer in the village of Bullet Tree Falls. He opened his medicine trails and workshop to local patients, interested visitors and students for many years. His healing practices included Maya prayers and blessings to bring out the healing powers during the preparations of remedies and treatments.

The two week courses are:

- Health, Belief and Ethnomedicine: Traditional Healing and Medical Anthropology in Belize
- Global Health: Biology, Medicine and Public Health in the Tropics

All courses incorporate as much practical and field experience as possible.

Scholarship application deadlines (apply as early as possible, space in classes is limited)

- **October 1** for winter
- **March 1** for summer

CELA Scholarships:

CELA Belize will sponsor scholarships for **students in the field of anthropology** in each period (one for winter and one for summer session). Each scholarship has a value of 50% of the regular cost of a single course or two courses. Students may choose among any courses offered. Additional charges (late arrival/early departure, extra transcripts, credit from a U.S. college/university, etc.) will be charged directly to the student at their full price.

Criteria:

- Students must be currently enrolled in a college or university program
- Students must be an active member of the American Anthropological Association, www.americananthro.org.
- Students pay a \$30 application fee to CELA and submit an online application indicating they are applying for the CELA Healthcare Scholarship. This is done through the CELA website [online application](#) process.

- Students applying for the scholarship will submit the following documents
 - A cover letter about themselves, their career aspirations, extra-curricular activities, language abilities, hobbies
 - A current resume highlighting any past healthcare volunteer experiences
 - A letter of recommendation from a professional (professor, employer)
 - An unofficial transcript from the student's home college/university.

Evaluation process for the scholarship:

CELA is looking for well-rounded students who have actively engaged in their communities and are clearly committed to a career in healthcare. While academic achievement is important, we will evaluate all documents submitted by the students.

Additional Costs: (Pricing is subject to change)

The following costs are not covered by the 50% program fee for the scholarship:

- \$30 – application fee
- Half of program fee:
 - Winter - One course approximately \$1500
 - Summer
 - One course approximately \$1400
 - Two courses approximately \$ 2500
- Airfare to Belize – varies by departure point and the season, on average about \$800 - 1200
- Personal budget for meals not covered, tourist trips within Belize, souvenirs, personal items, two weeks - \$300 – 500US and for four weeks - \$400-700US.
- Cost of international medical insurance
